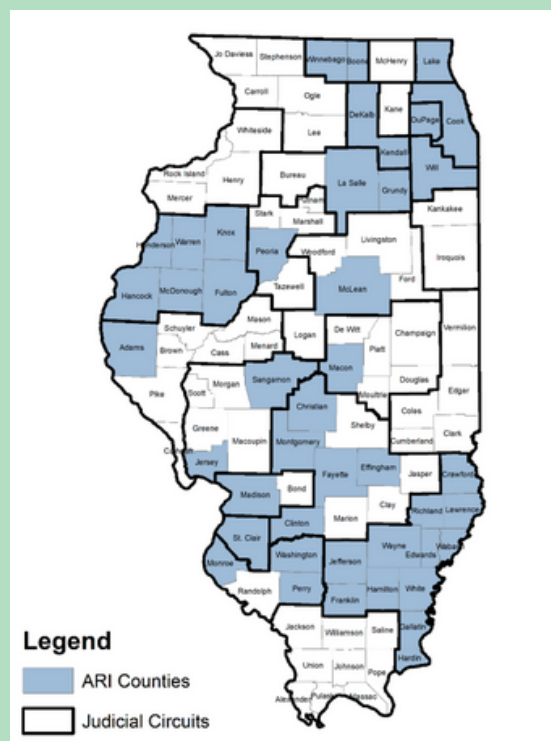




SFY22 IMPACT REPORT

In SFY22, **Adult Redeploy Illinois** supported its site network and worked toward strategic program expansion by releasing two funding opportunities to increase the breadth and depth of program impact. BY THE NUMBERS

\$8.6M in funding awarded to local jurisdictions

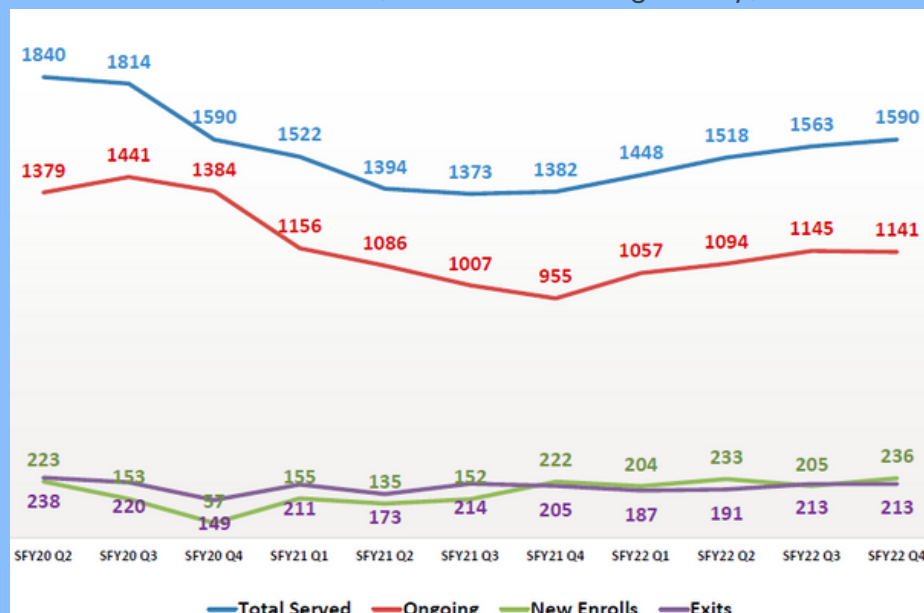
27 sites across **44** counties

2,160 individuals supervised and served in their communities

\$53M in state incarceration costs avoided

STRATEGIC EXPANSION

Service levels in ARI-funded programs steadily increased in SFY22 towards pre-pandemic levels. New funding was used to expand implementation in two counties (Clinton and Jersey) and planning activities in two other counties (Cook and Montgomery).



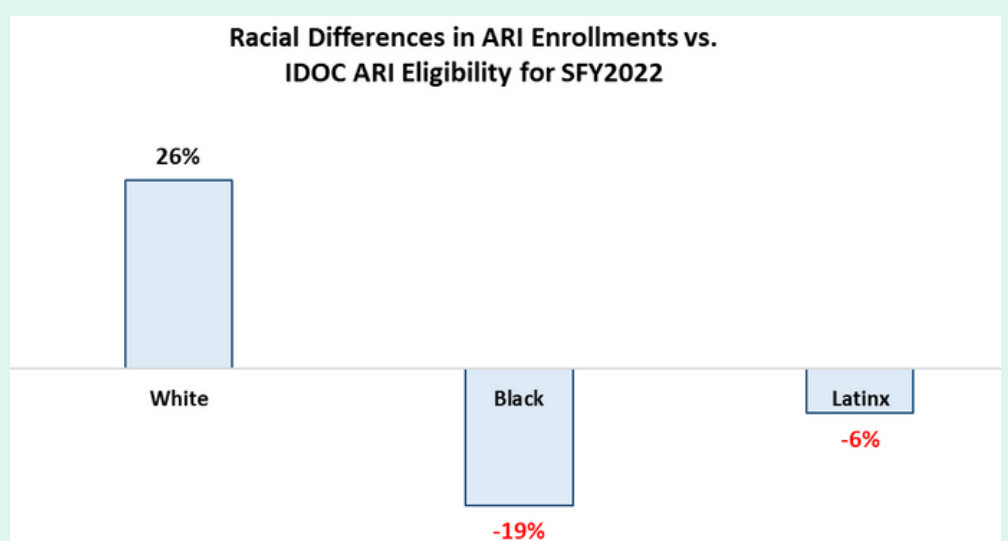
Sites increased investments addressing **social determinants of health** to support reintegration including:

- Housing
- Transportation
- Client legal aid
- Peer/recovery support
- Education and employment assistance

STRIVING TOWARD EQUITY

All eligible individuals should have equal access to ARI-funded prison diversion programs. While data analysis showed there were no significant racial differences in ARI program outcomes and IDOC admissions in SFY22, there were differences when comparing the percentages by race of ARI enrollments and ARI-eligible IDOC admissions .

Similar findings in SFY17 and SFY19 data propelled the ARI Oversight Board, staff, and site network to explore ways to expand program access and reduce barriers to enrollment for all those who can benefit from the programs and services ARI funds across the state.
